will go down with thee.

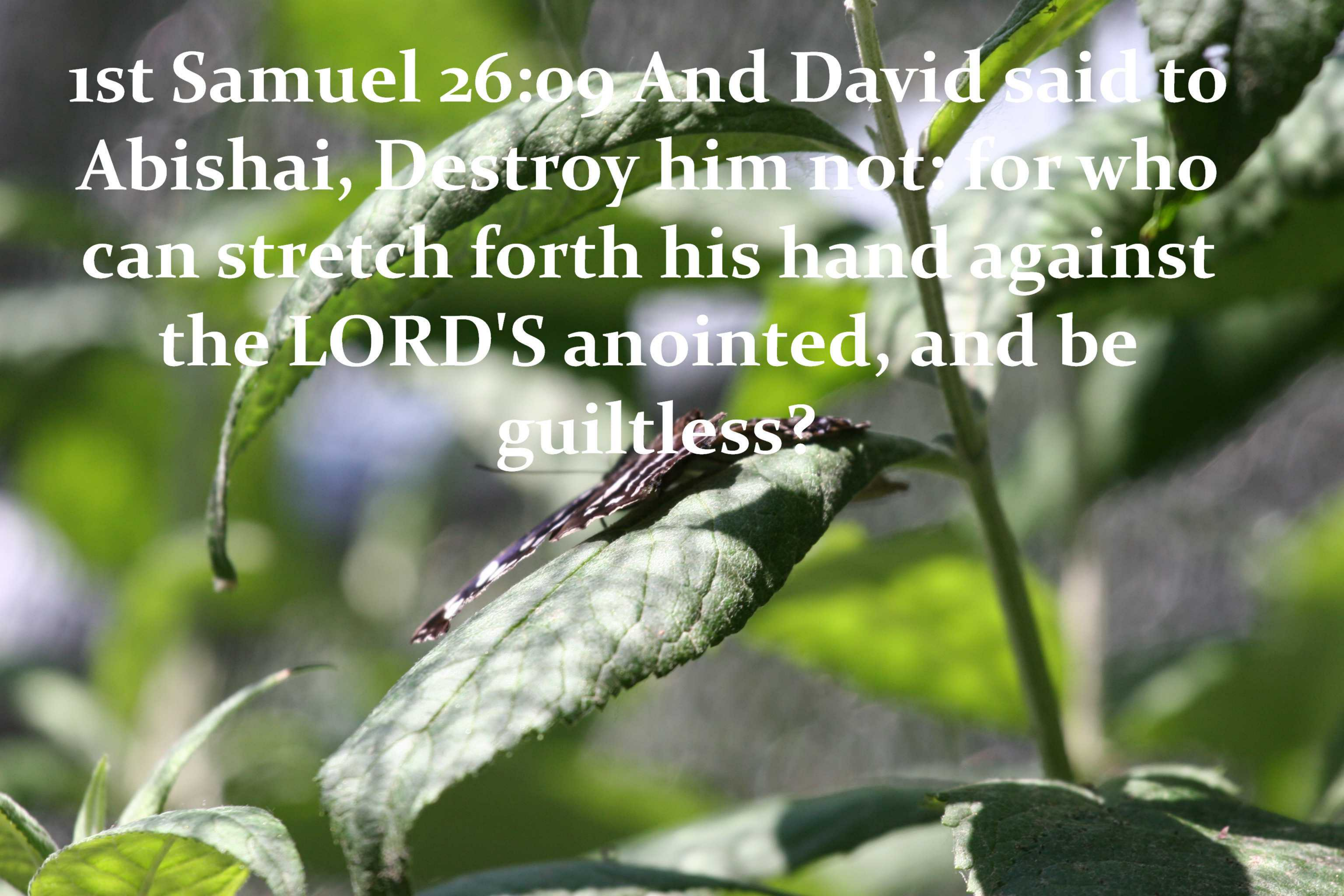


1st Samuel 26:07 So David and

lay round about him.

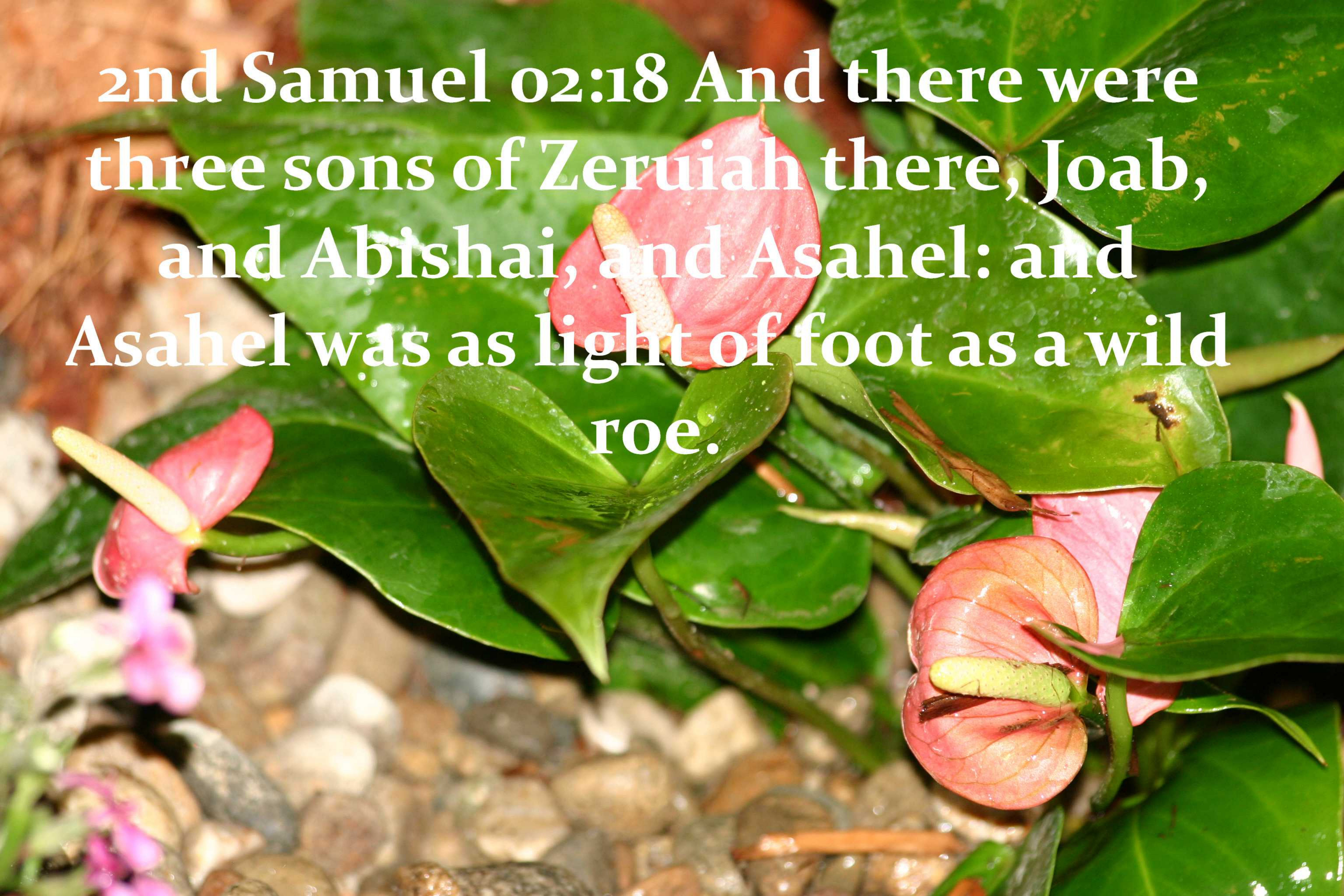



1st Samuel 26:08 Then said Abishai

guiltless?




2nd Samuel 02:18 And there were

roe.



son of Bichri.








