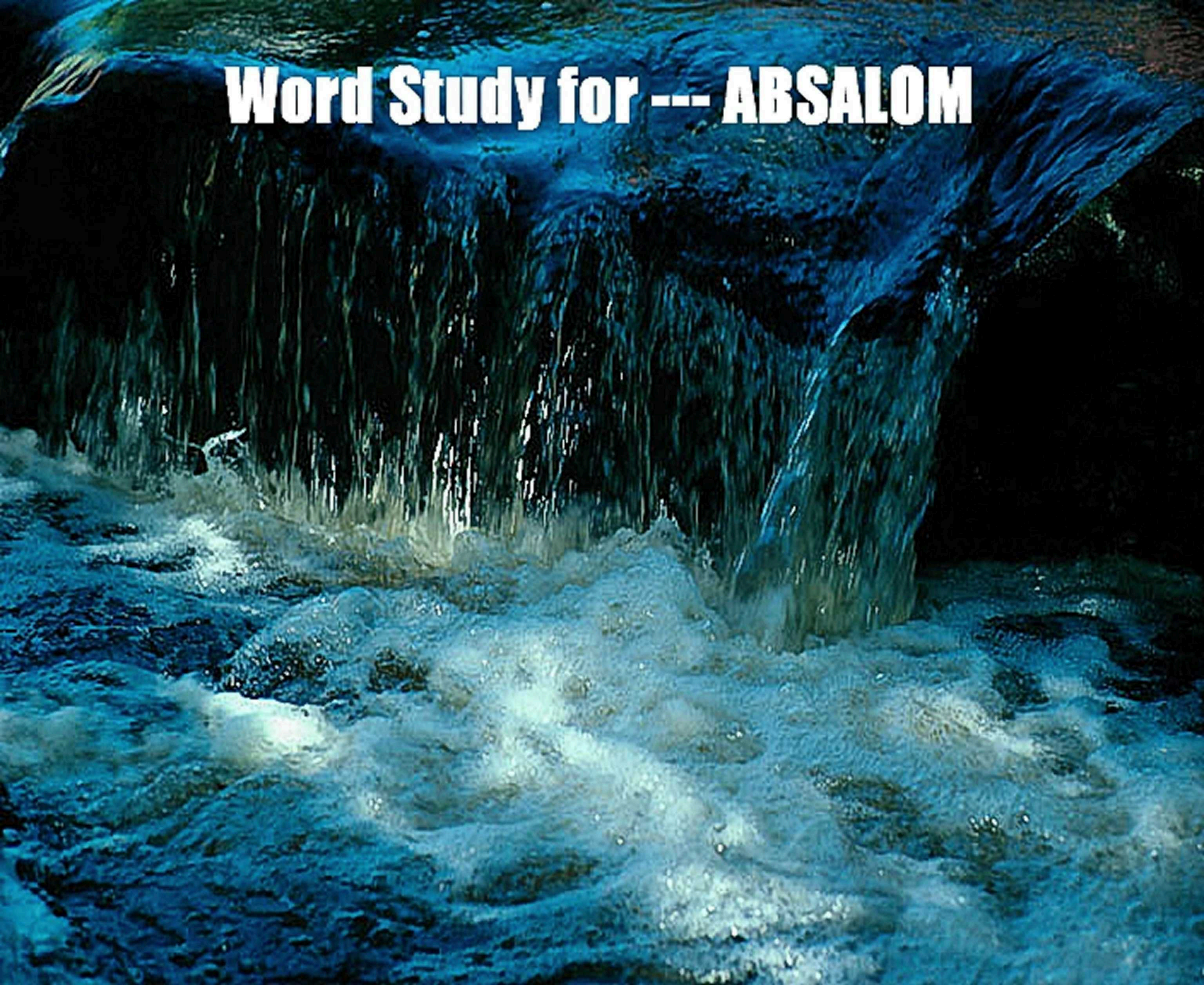



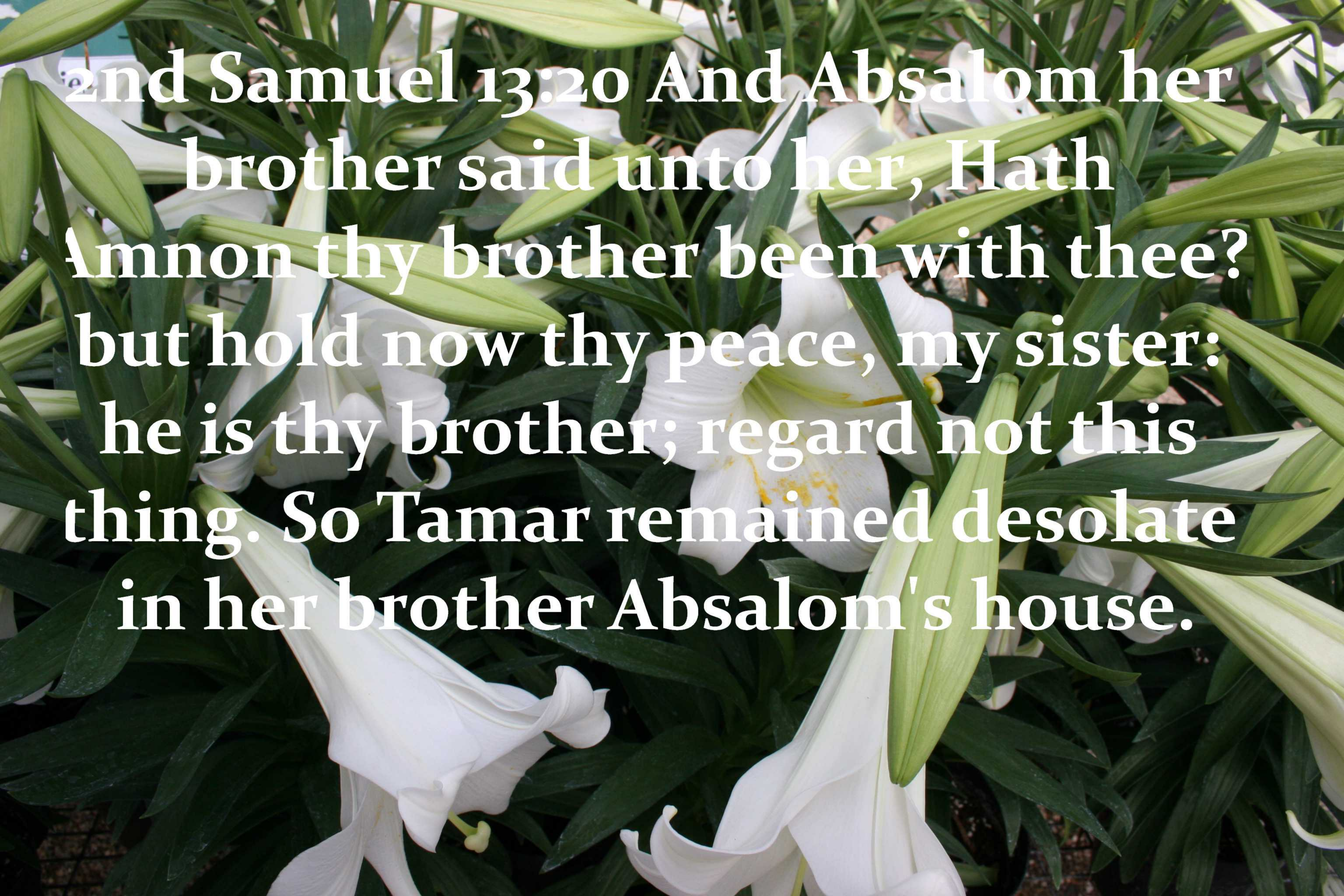
2nd Samuel 03:03 And his second,


2nd Samuel 13:01 And it came to

Amnon the son of David loved her.






2nd Samuel 13:20 And Absalom her

in her brother Absalom's house.







Absalom came into Jerusalem.



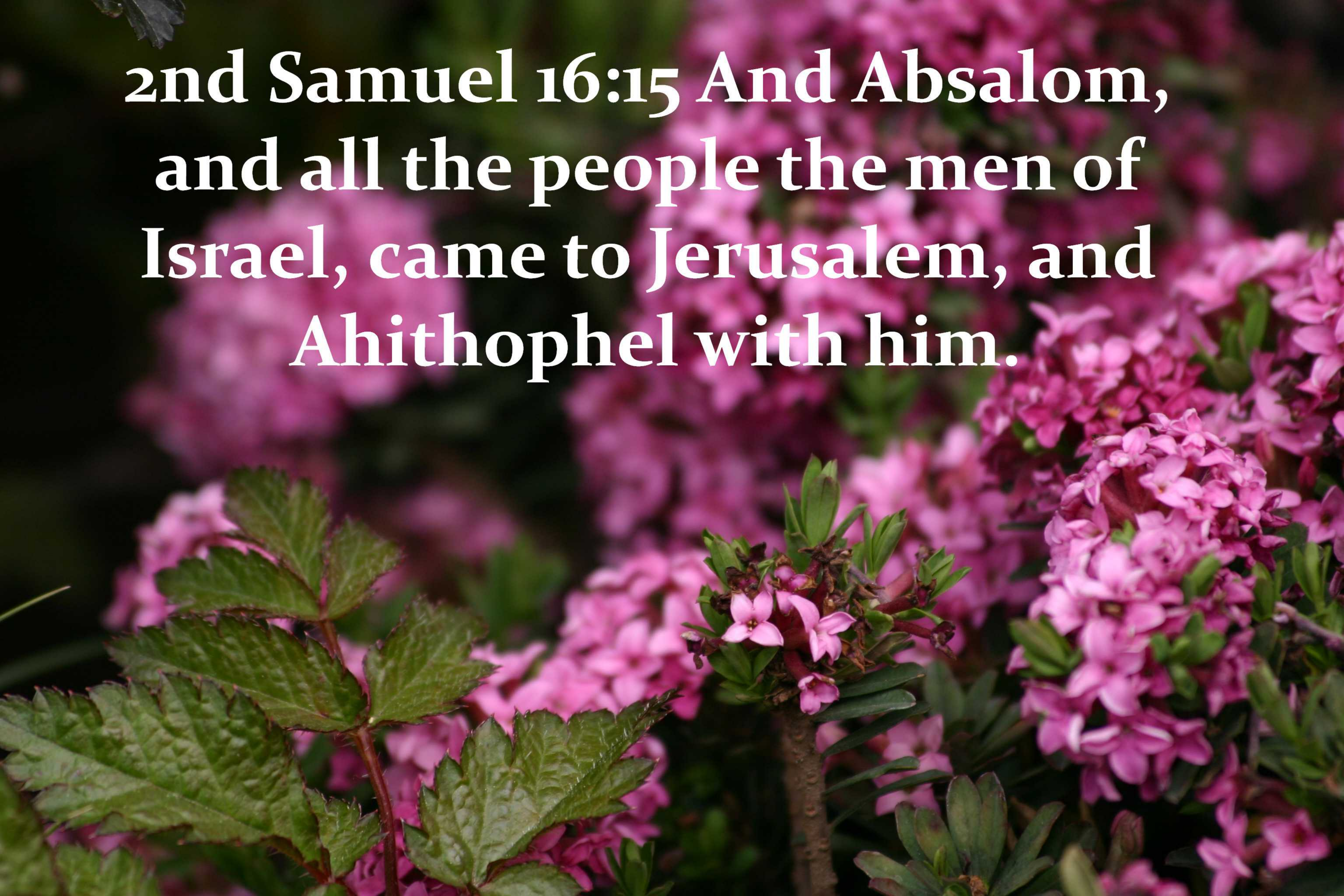
