one another in the face.



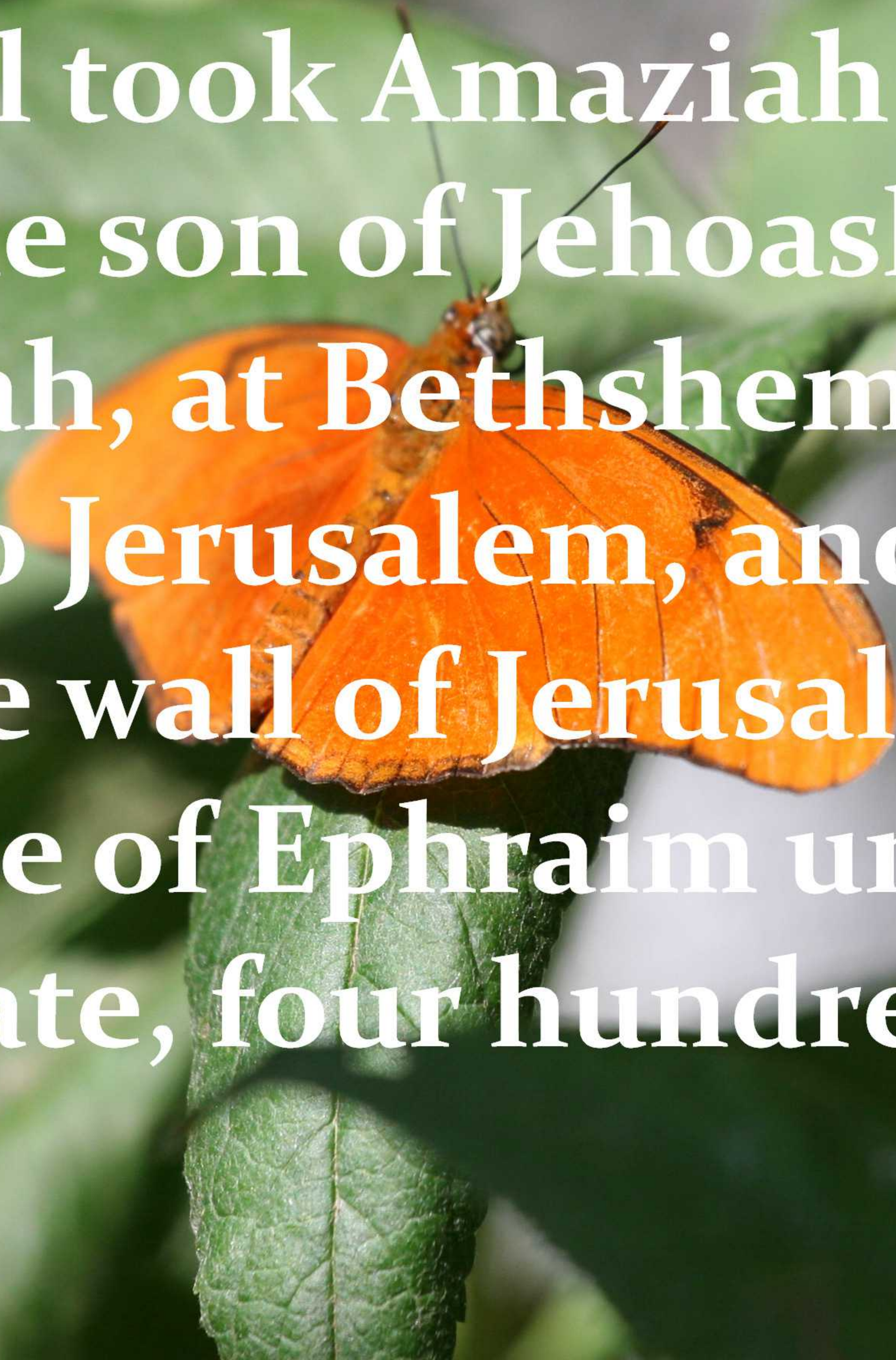

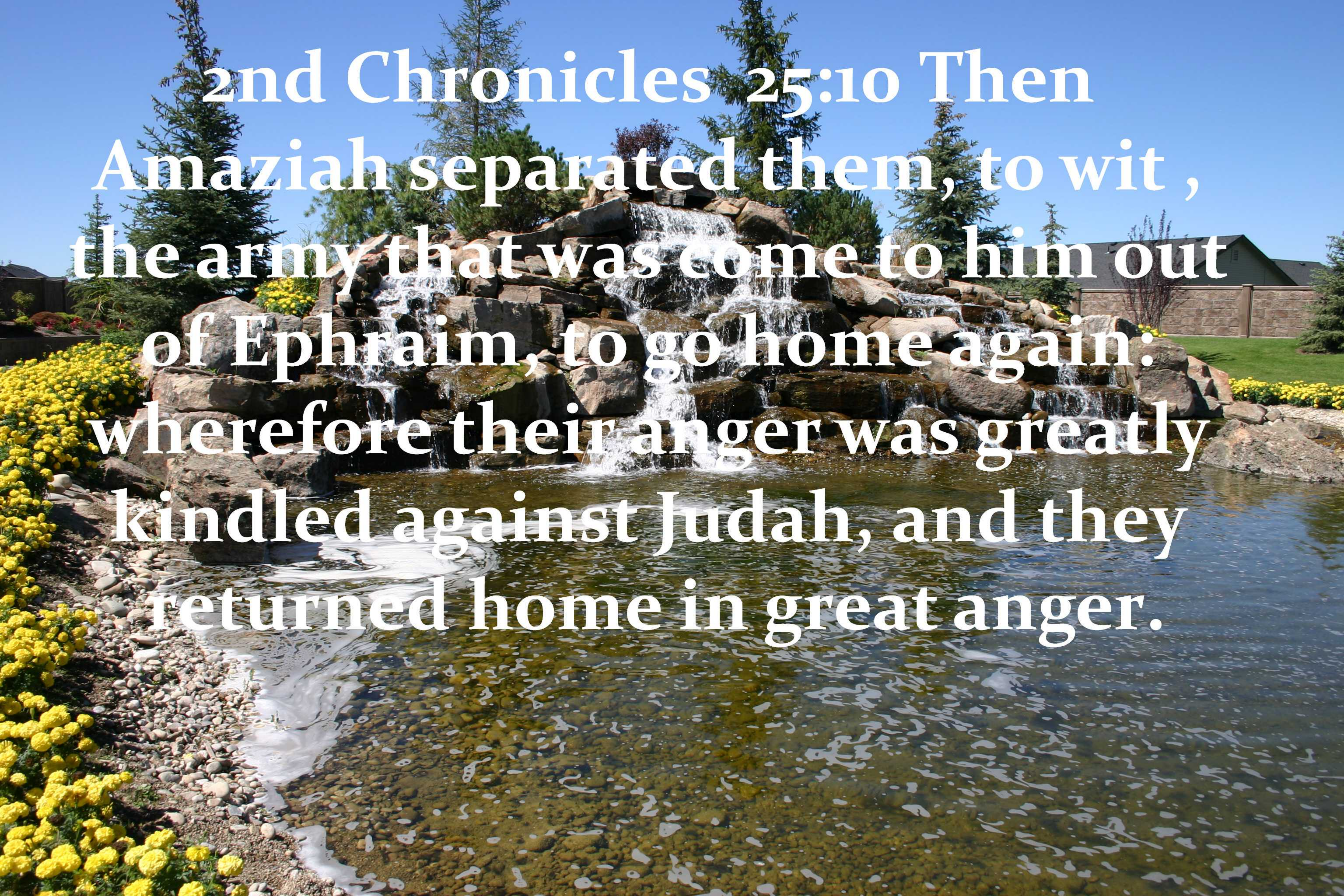


2nd Chronicles 25:01 Amaziah was

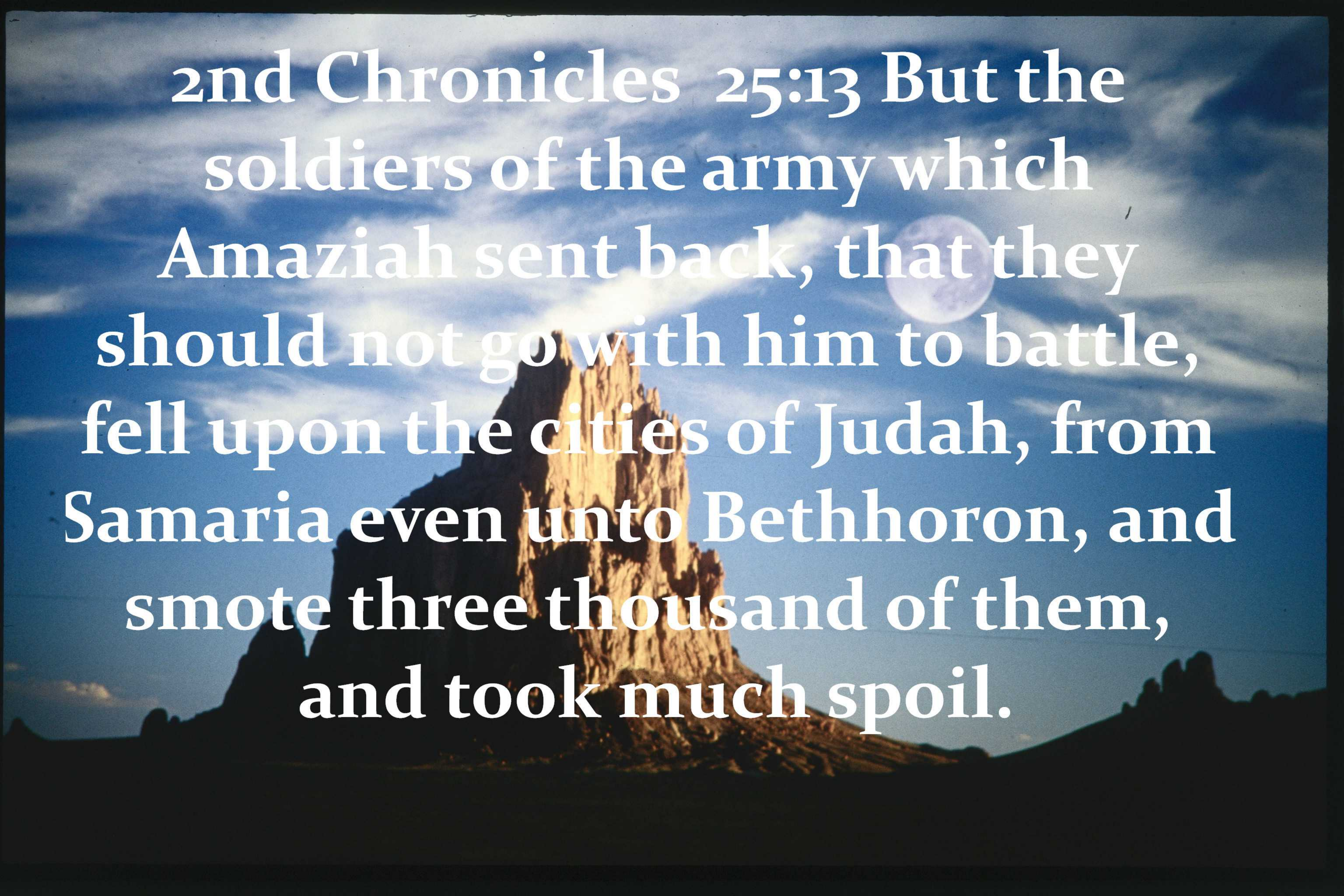

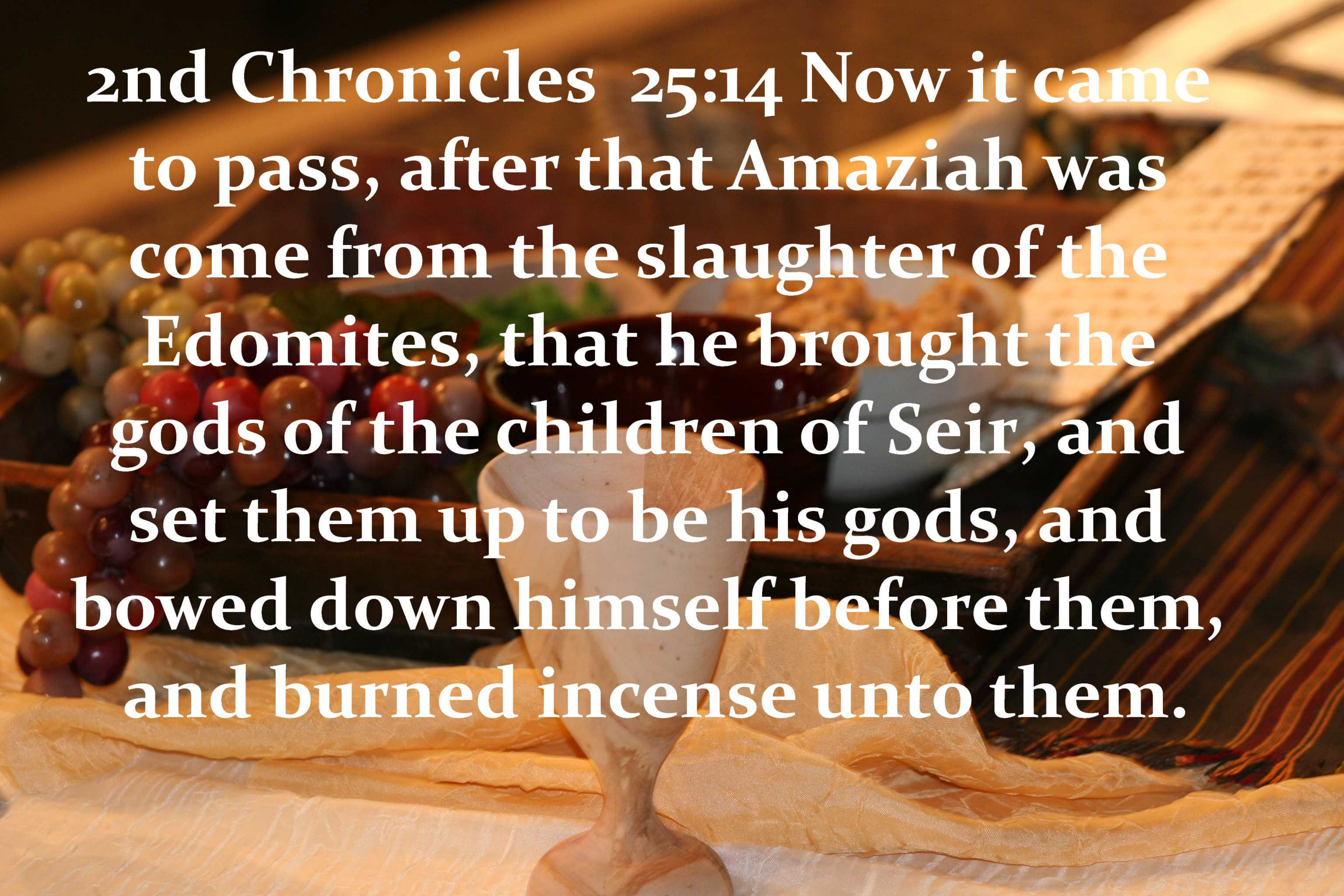

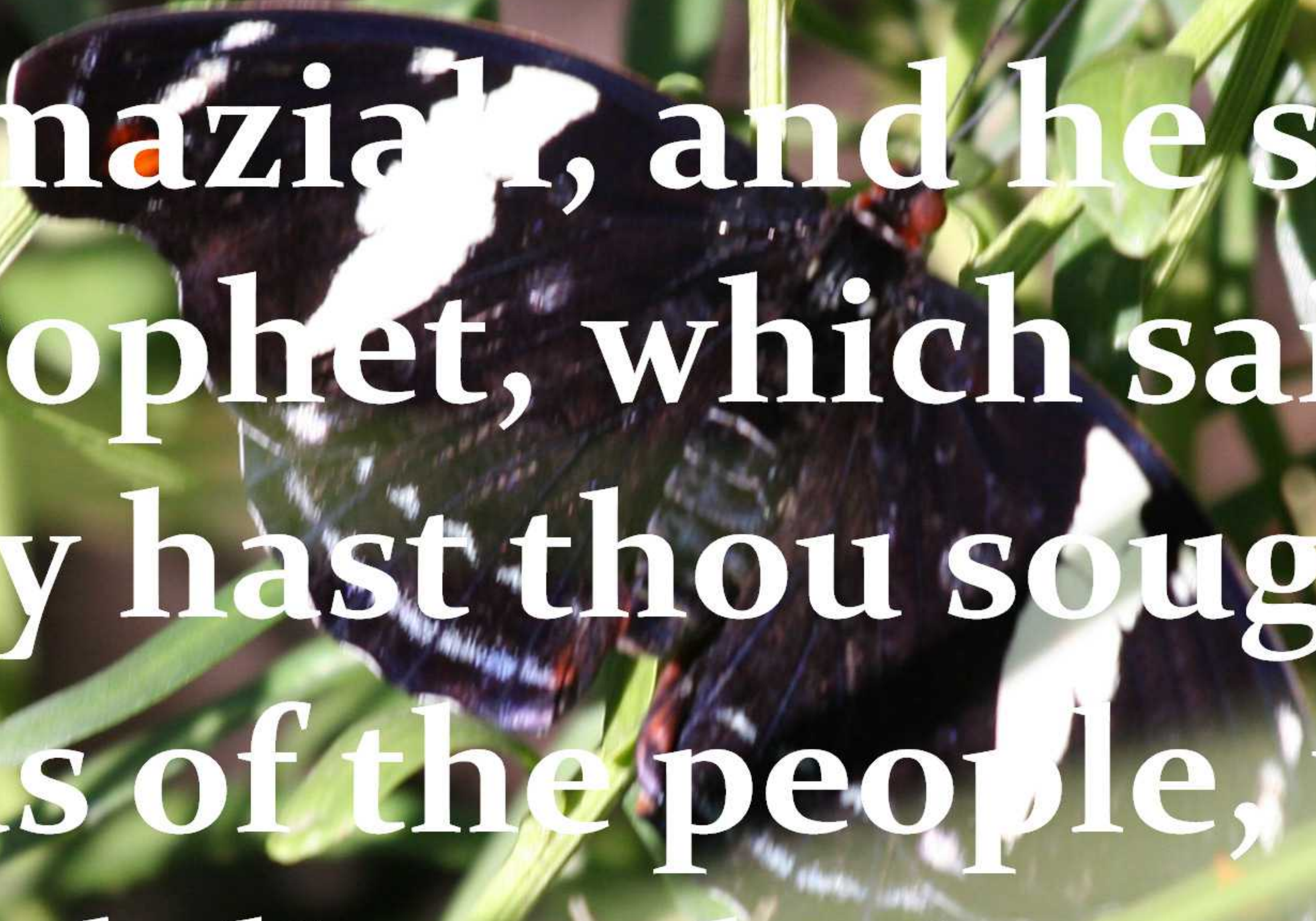




2nd Chronicles 25:13 But the
