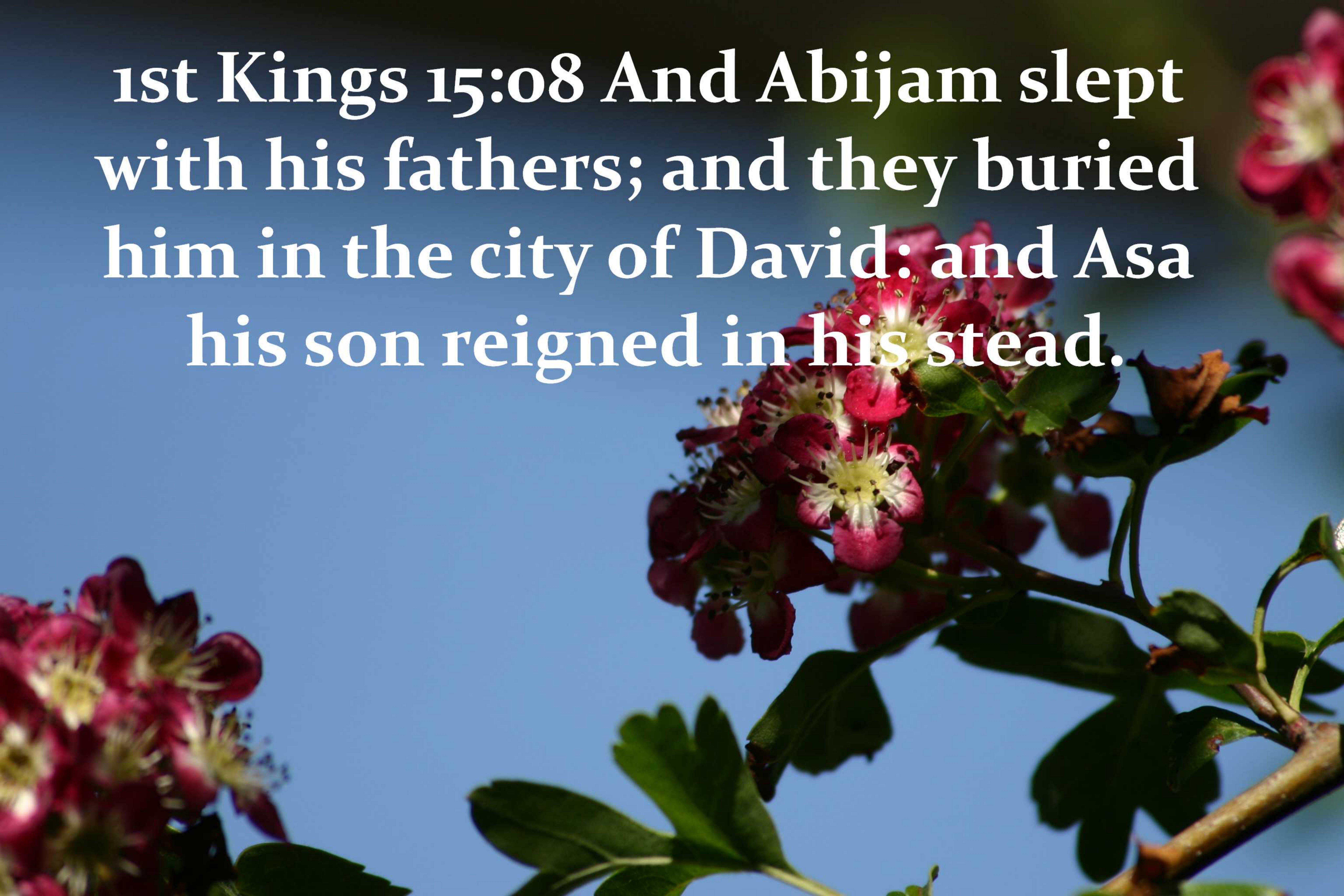


1st Kings 15:08 And Abijam slept

his son reigned in his stead.



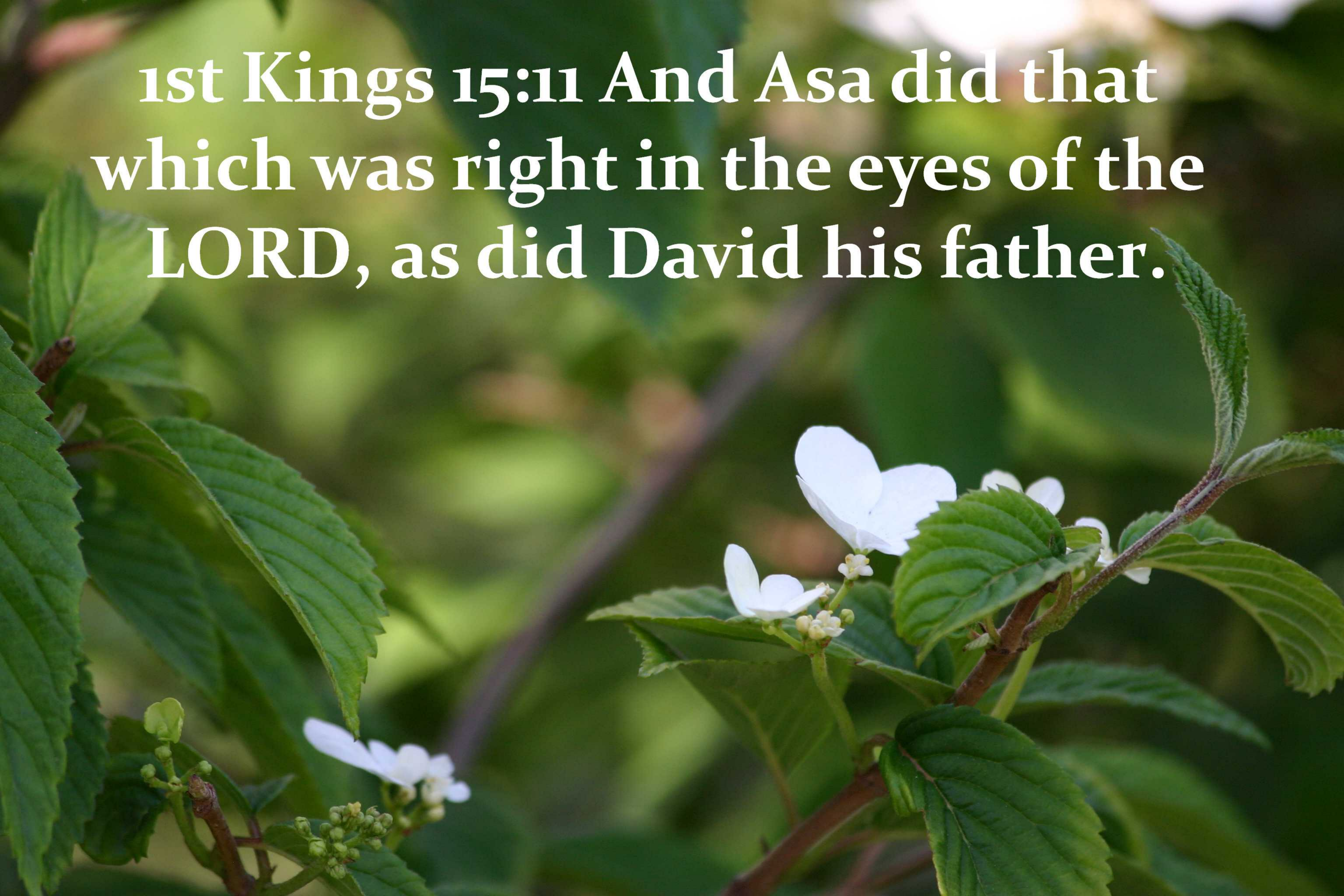


1st Kings 15:09 And in the

Israel reigned Asa over Judah.






1st Kings 15:11 And Asa did that




1st Kings 15:17 And Baasha king of Israel went up against Judah, and built Ramah, that he might not suffer any to go out or come in to Asa king of Judah.

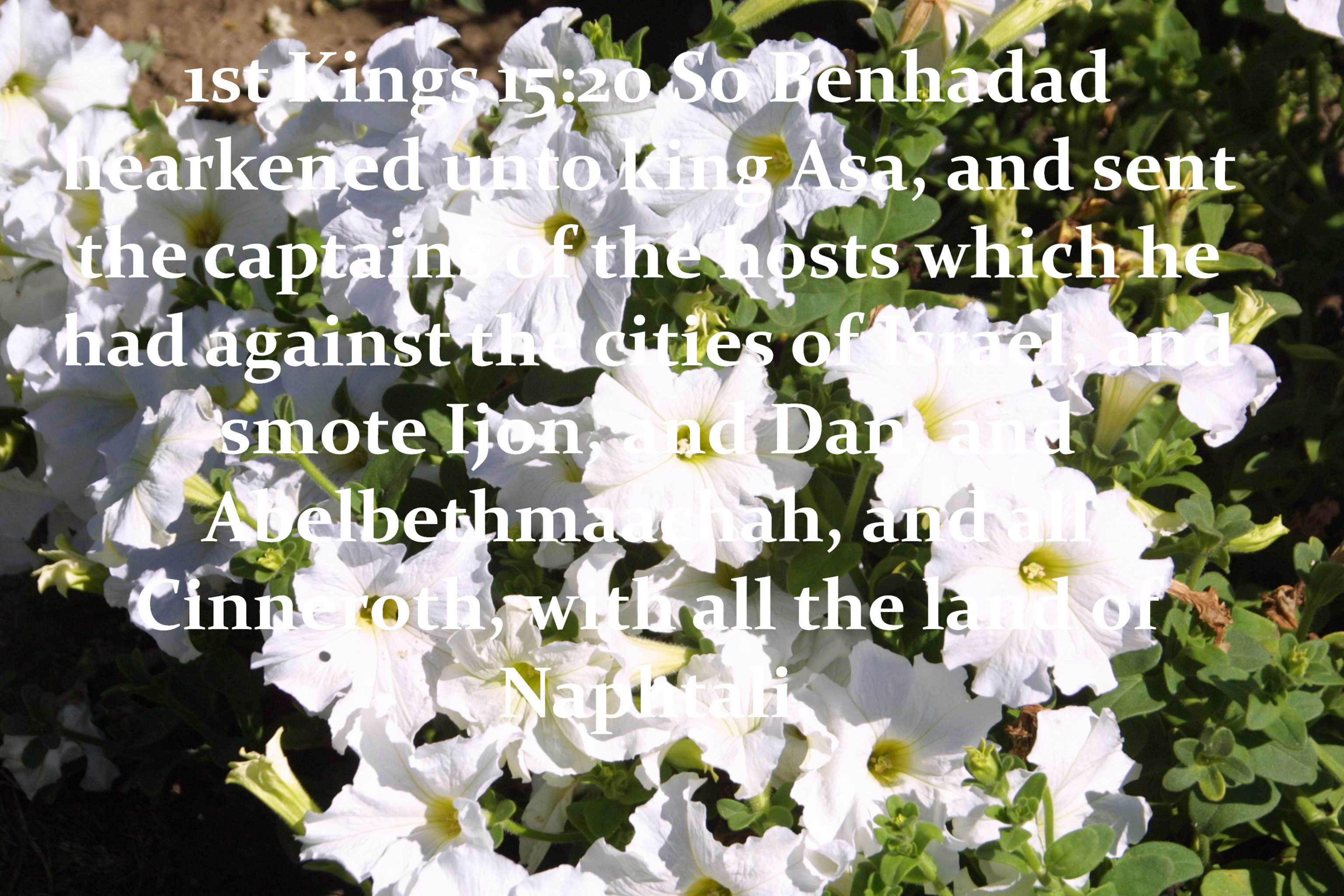









1st Kings 15:20 So Benhadad

of Benjamin, and Mizpah.

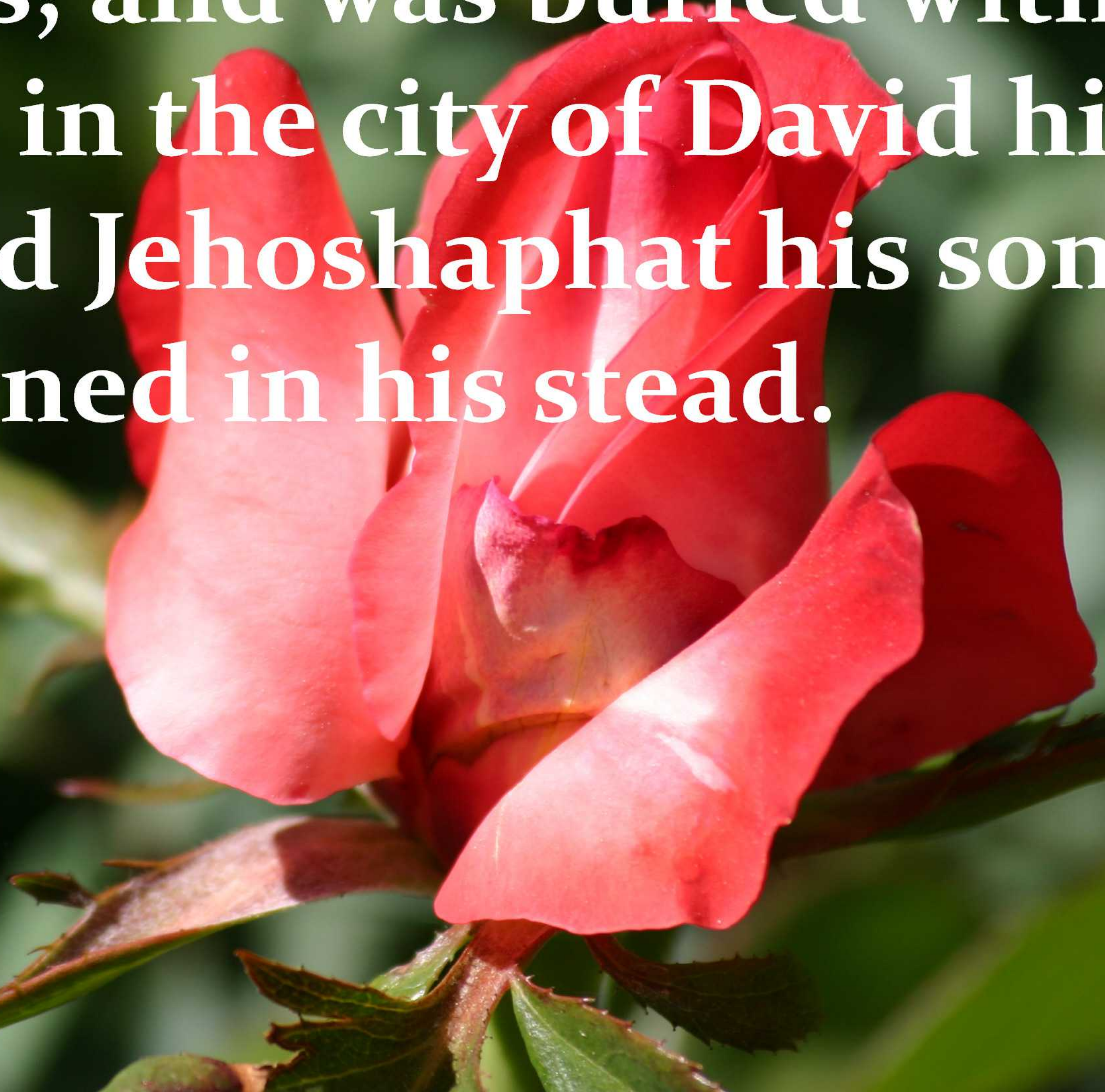




1st Kings 16:29 And in the thirty



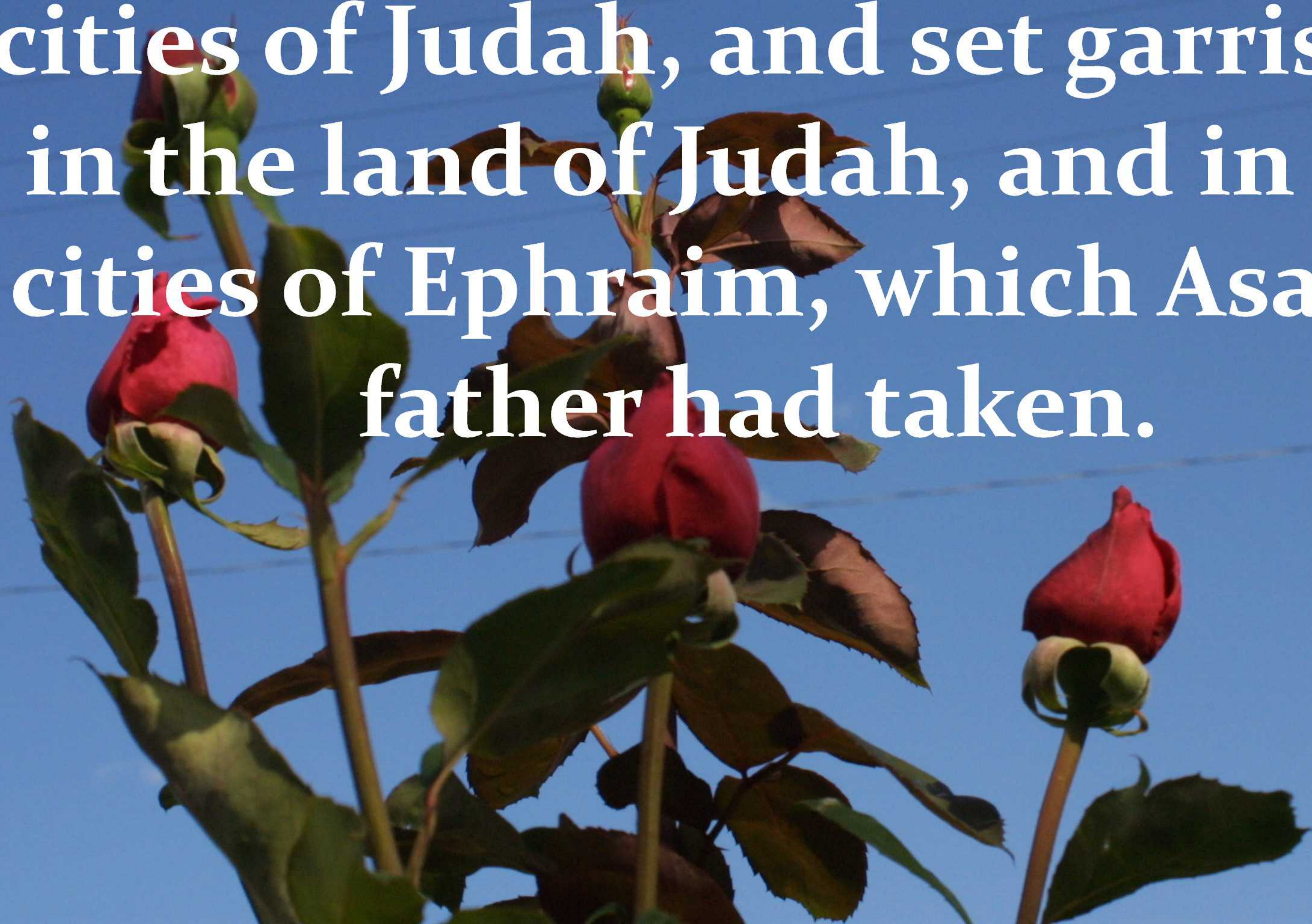


2nd Chronicles 16:13 And Asa slept




