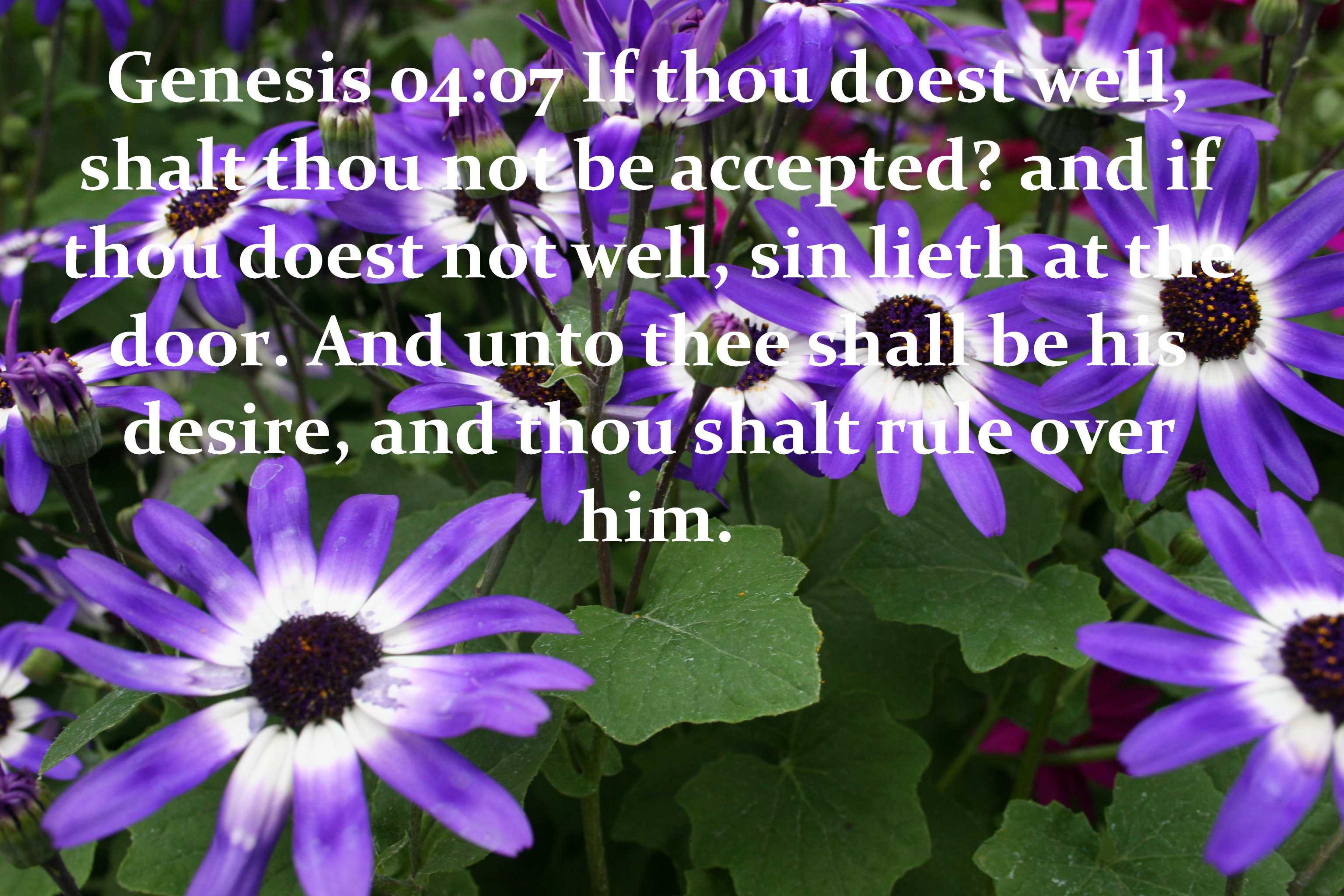


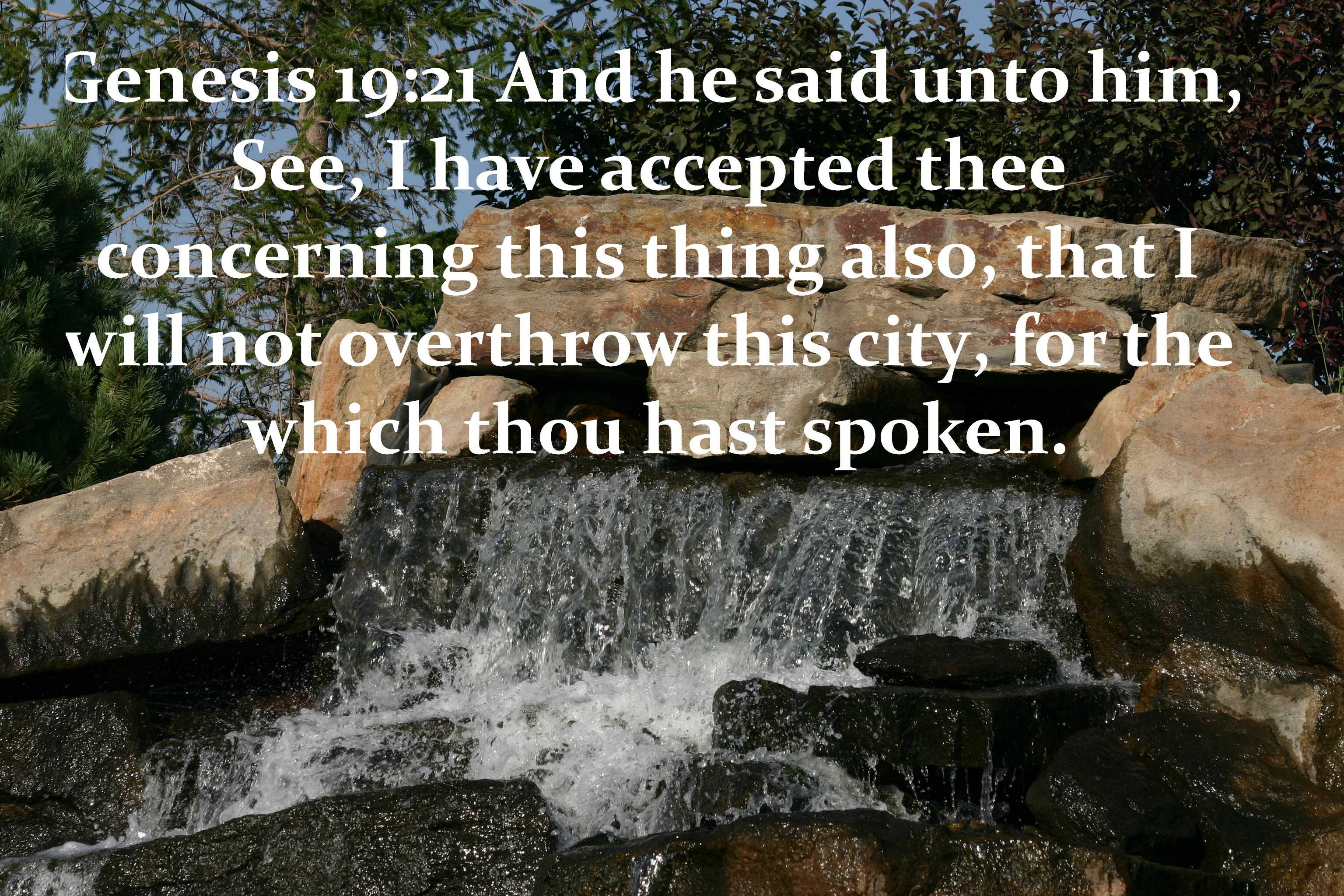

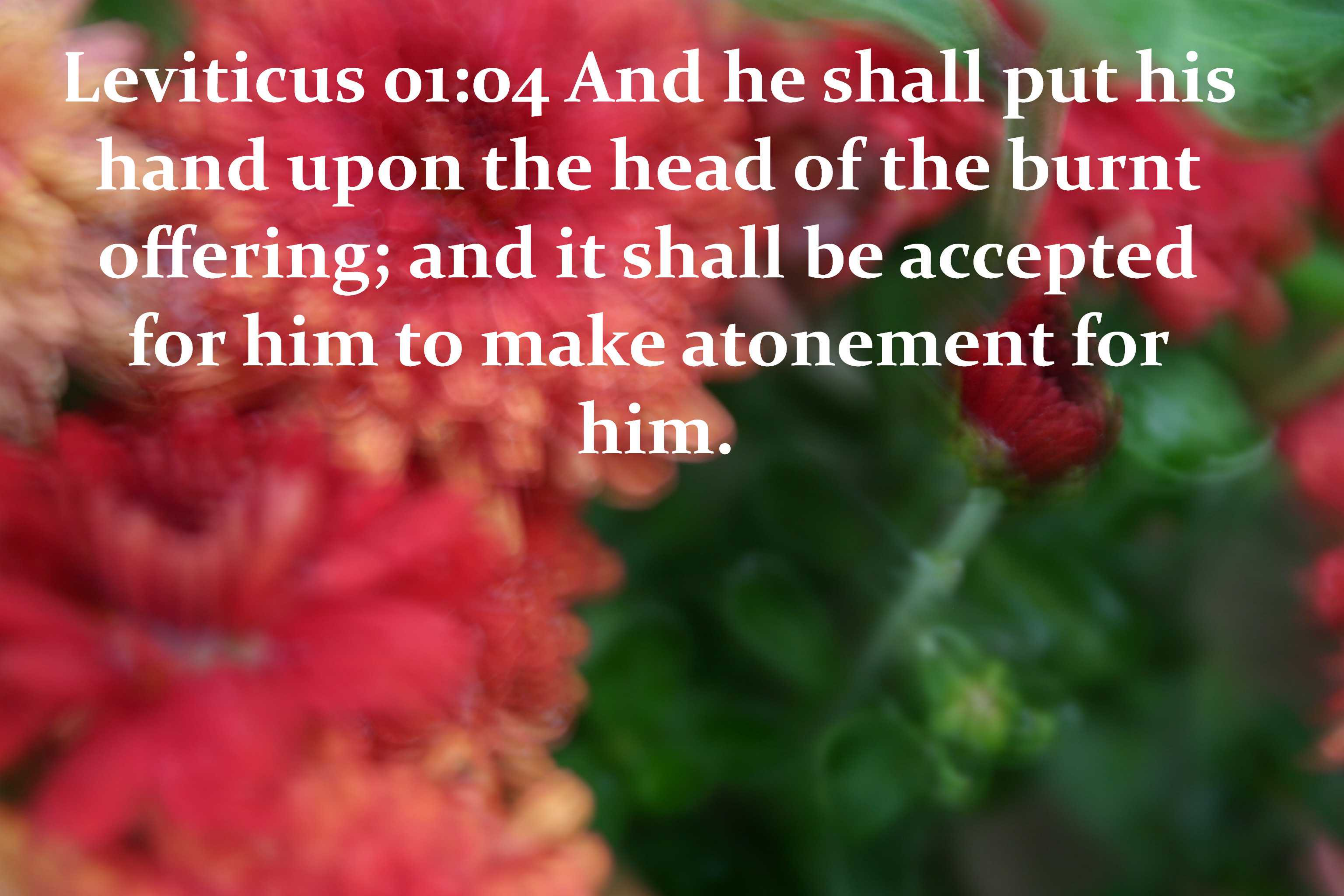
Genesis 04:07 If thou doest well,

which thou hast spoken.

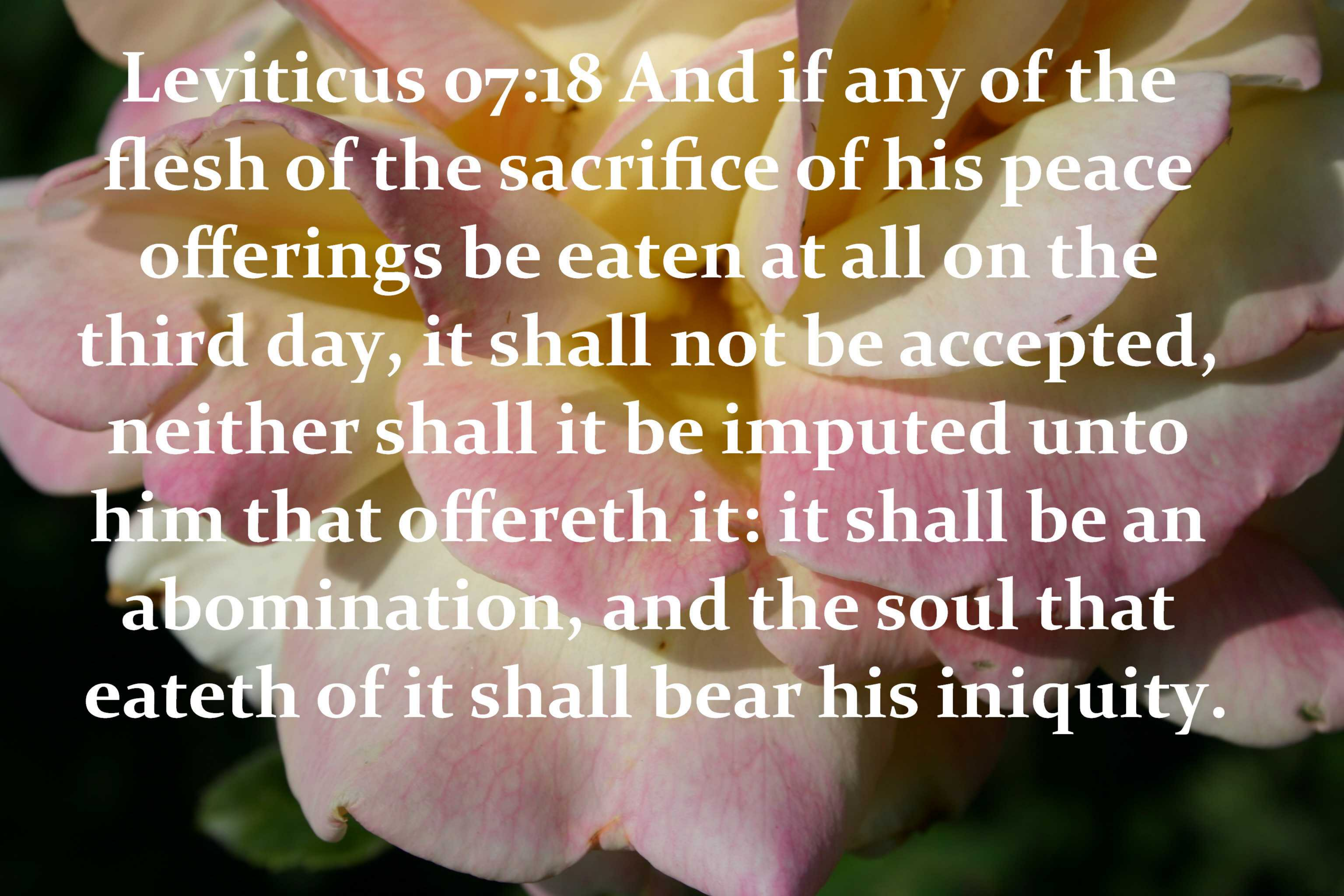




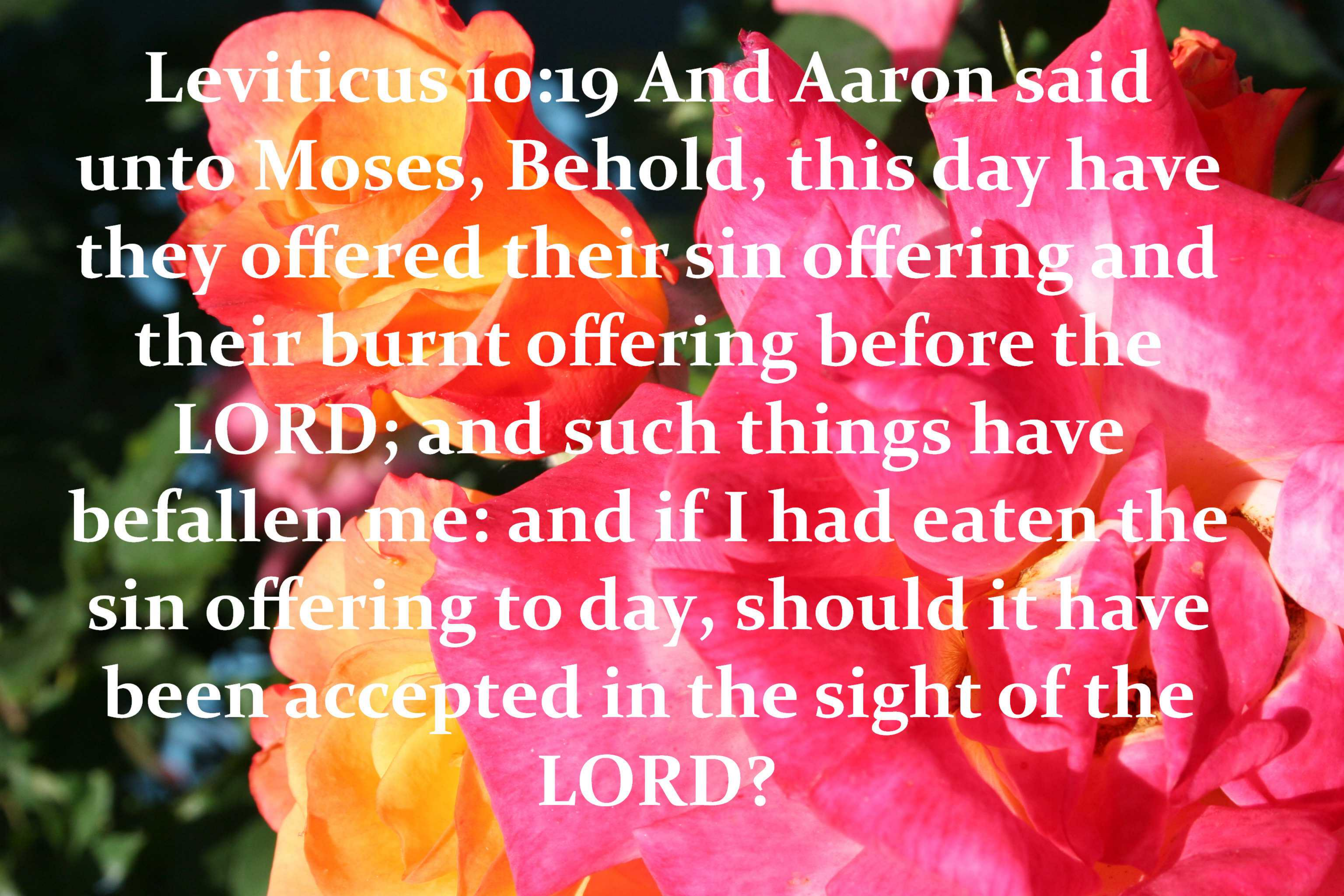
Exodus 28:38 And it shall be upon

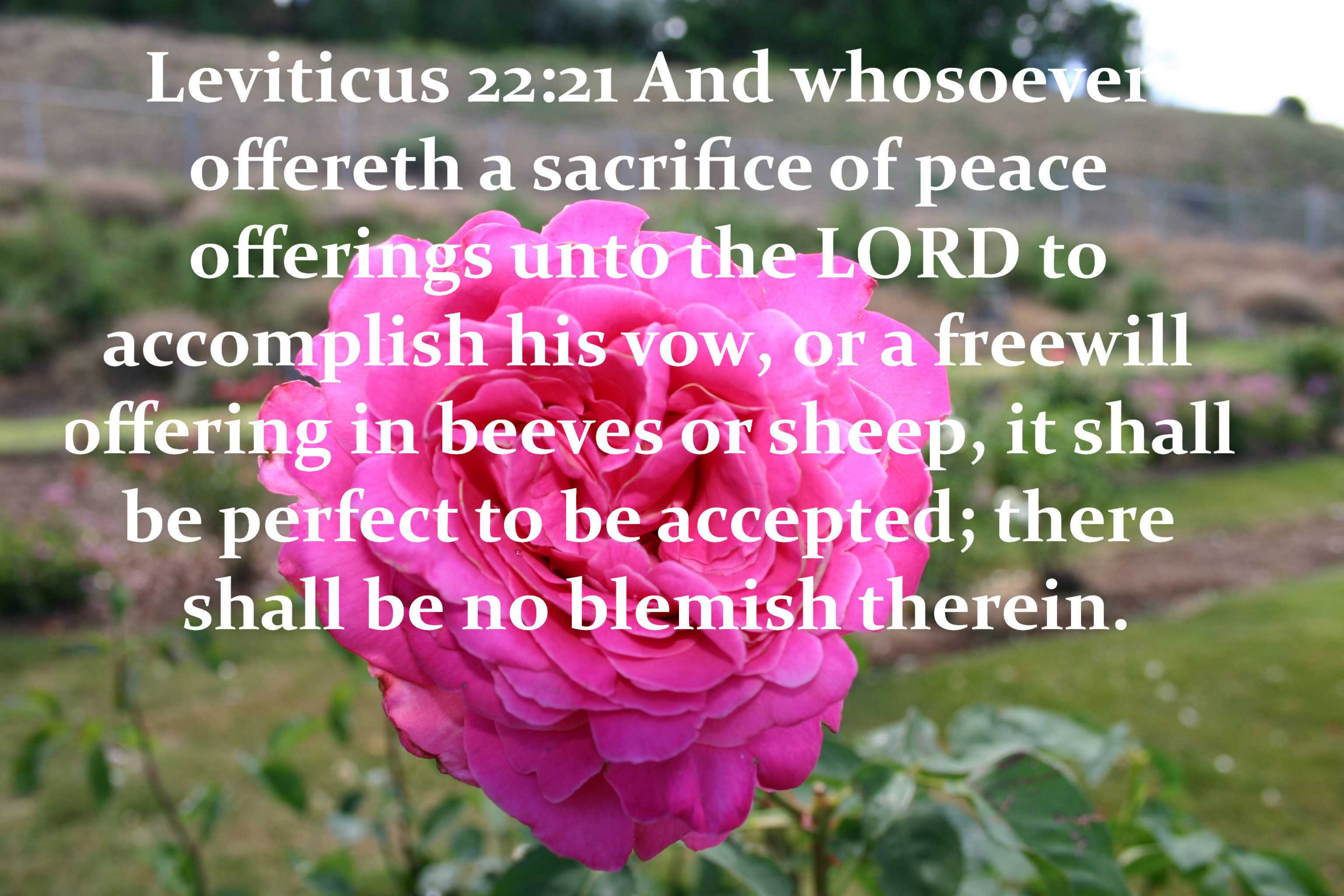


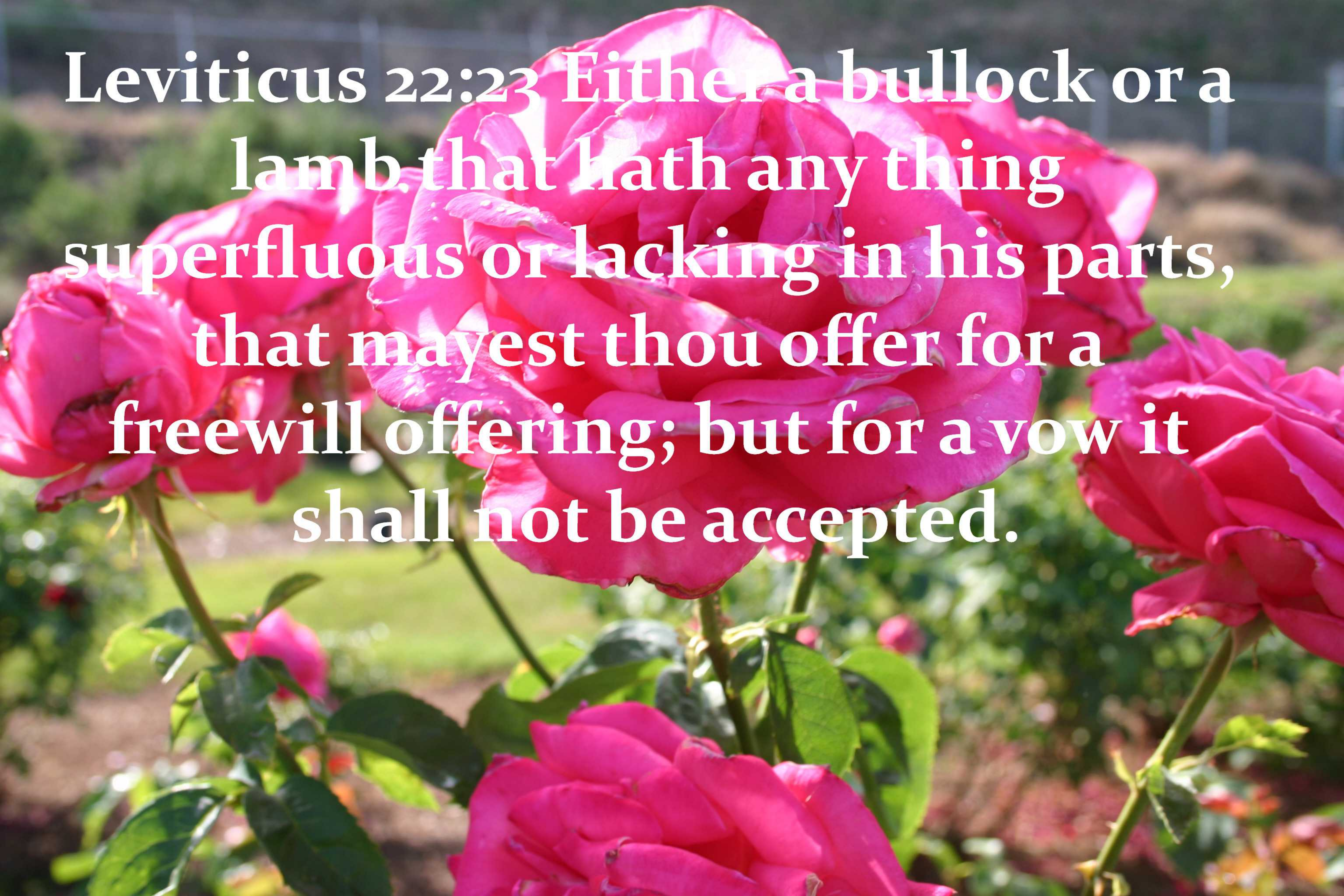

LORD?



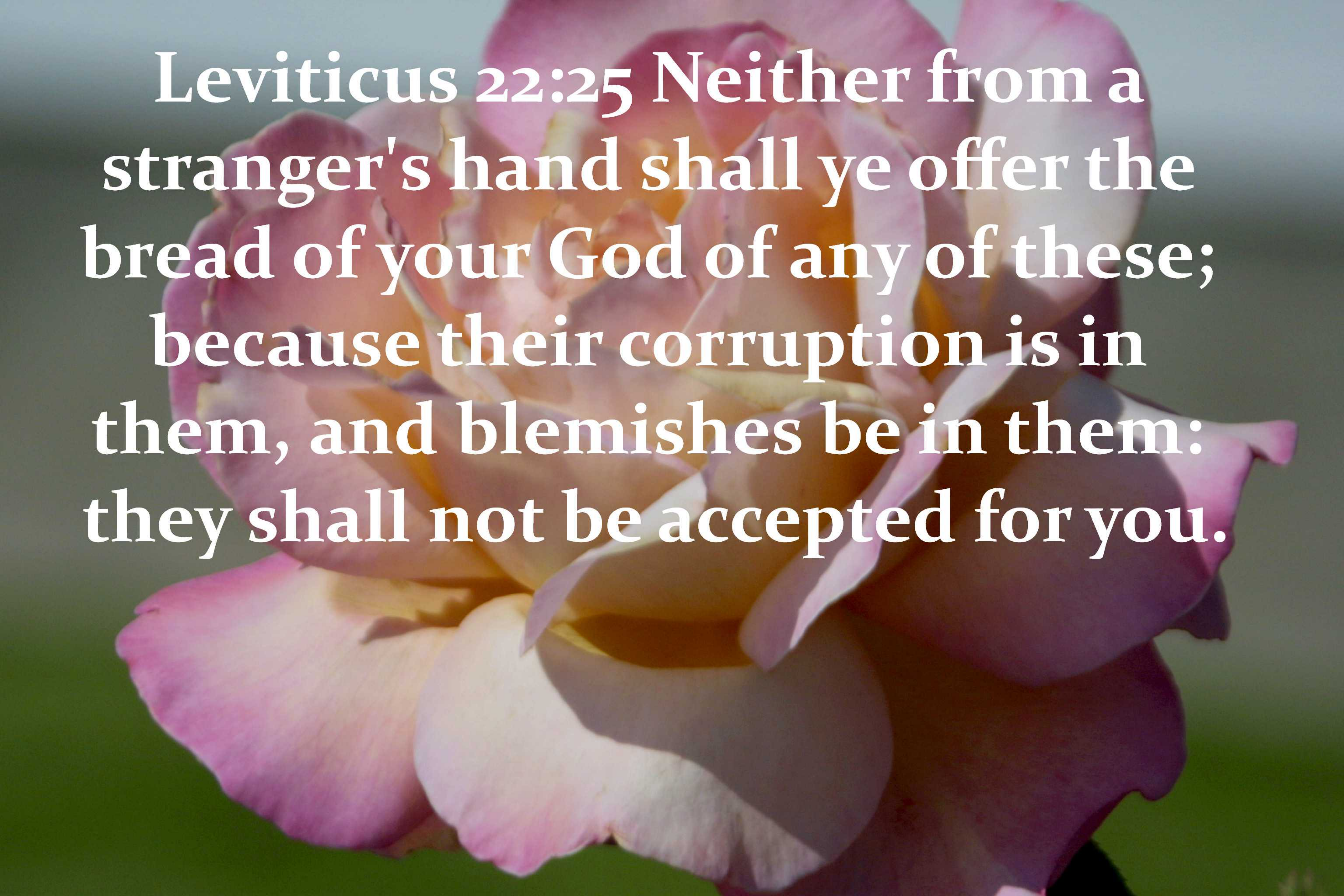
Leviticus 19:07 And if it be eaten at

shall be no blemish therein.

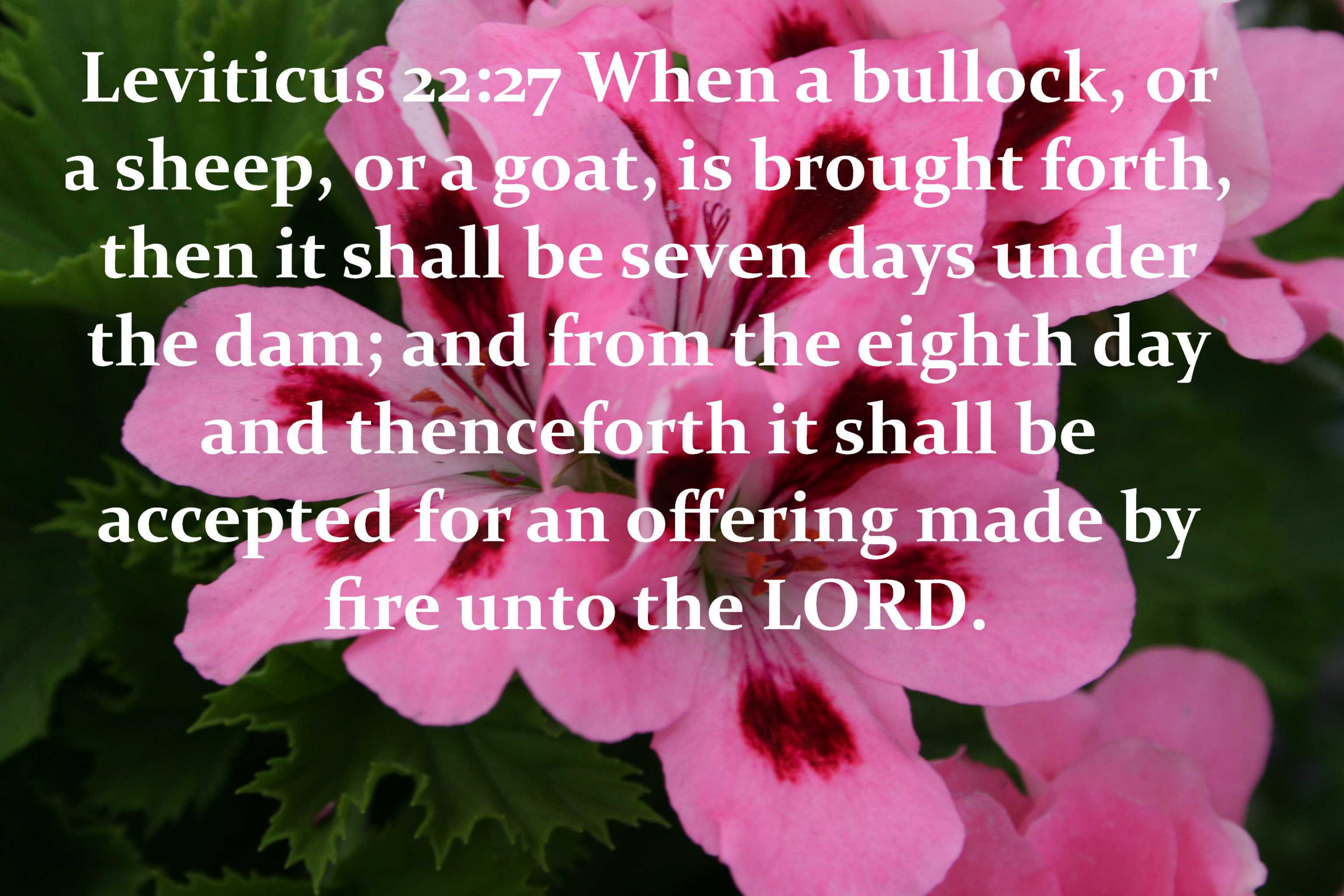
